SEXUAL OFFENDER REGISTRATION

RSA 651-B:9 Failure to Comply with Requirements of Sexual Offender Registration

The defendant is charged with the crime of failure to comply with requirements of sexual offender registration. The definition of this crime has three parts or elements. The State must prove each element beyond a reasonable doubt. In this case the State must prove that:

1. The defendant was a convicted sex offender; and
2. The defendant failed to [specify the applicable statutory variant under RSA 651-B:4 or 5]; and
3. The defendant acted knowingly.

These are the elements of the crime of failure to comply with requirements of sexual offender registration. Certain words in the definition need to be defined.
