New Hampshire Public Radio- *Criminal Justice Reporting*

\$5,000 - focus on underreported elements of the criminal justice system and the stories of the incarcerated, who despite their position at the center of the system, have few channels for making their voices heard.

\$5,000 - to show an 80-minute documentary on incarcerated women through-out the state of New Hampshire to raise awareness about the issues faced by women imprisoned.
