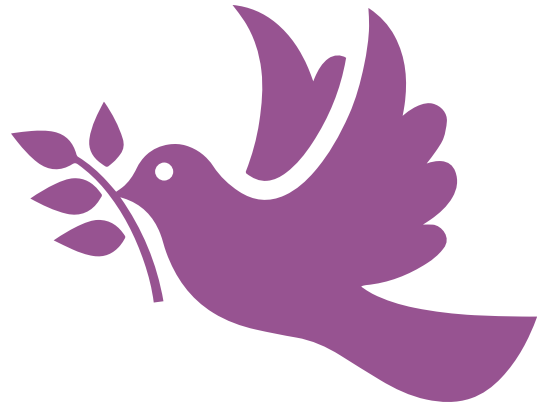
DOVE is a special project of the New Hampshire Bar Association's Pro Bono Referral Program, which provides free civil legal services to low-income people through the donated services of local, private attorneys.

Protection from Domestic Violence

DOVE offers free legal representation in civil court at final Domestic Violence Restraining Order hearings under RSA 173-B. A restraining order or domestic violence protective order is designed to protect you from actual or threatened physical violence by a family or household member, or current/former intimate partner.

Protection from Stalking

The DOVE Project also offers free legal representation in civil court for final Stalking Restraining Order hearings under New Hampshire RSA 633:3-a. A stalking protective order or restraining order is designed to protect you from stalking behavior — two or more acts that are targeted at a specific individual with the intent to cause fear.



Apply for Help

You do not have to do this alone.
